- We continue to coordinate the academic, museographic and collection tasks of Maná, Museo de la Biblia in Mexico City.
- This year 2025 the Museum will celebrate its 25 years of existence and there will be more work than usual. Organize we have the ninth Research congress with the theme of how did the Bible come to Mexico and Latin America?

FINANCIAL NEEDS:

- The property on which the Museum is located is very old and requires reconstruction of foundations to obtain government permits for public exhibits. The expense amounts to more than 4 million Mexican pesos that we must raise.
- Also, the minimum wage imposed by the government is higher than last year, which requires us to achieve higher income to maintain our collaborators with social security.
