DEALING WITH FALSE ASSUMPTIONS ABOUT MISSIONARY SUPPORT: WHY IT STILL MATTERS

Many false assumptions surround missionary support—ideas like "it's not as important today" or "missionaries don't need as much help anymore." These misconceptions hinder the progress of vital Gospel work. Missionaries play an irreplaceable role in sharing Christ's love across the globe, and supporting them is as crucial now as ever.

The Challenges of Modern Missionary Work

Contrary to popular belief, the challenges missionaries face have not diminished in the modern era—they've evolved. From cultural and language barriers to the high cost of living and travel in remote areas, missionaries face logistical, emotional, and spiritual challenges daily. Many work in regions hostile to Christianity, risking their safety to share the Gospel. Yet, their resolve mirrors Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 4:8-9: "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."
