

Ronald Kalimbuka, with Grace of God Orphan Ministry as director in Malawi (GoGOM), was established in 2002 and registered as a faith-based organization in 2008 to respond to the increasing problem of orphans with no family support and lacking basic necessities such as food, shelter, school fees, writing materials, and uniforms.

'Christian Women Economic Empowerment Program (Christian-WEEP)'

To reach out to 480 Christian women in 24 groups of 20 women each per church with the Word of God and business skills by September 30, 2030.

To economically empower 480 Christian women in 24 groups of 20 women each per church by September 30, 2030.

Women's capacity building in understanding the word of God.

Women's capacity building in business skills and preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Disbursement of revolving loans to the 24 Women Groups in 24 different churches.

ADULT BIBLE-BASED LITERACY PROGRAM

Malawi is one of the poorest countries in the world, as few men and women can read and write. The illiteracy level in Malawi is too high, especially among women and girls. Therefore, as Grace of God Orphan Ministry, we start an open school of literacy to ensure that people know how to read and write as well as ensure that they are able to read and understand the Bible after teaching them.

Lay Pastors

In July 2024, Grace of God Orphan Ministry introduced pastors targeting capacity-building projects targeting those pastors who are ministering with no formal qualifications from any Bible school. So far we have established two free Bible classes in Monkey Bay and Mangochi District, the southern part of Malawi, with 46 pastors in total undergoing free pastoral lessons.
